


Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster is the agency charged with administering adjudicated water rights and managing groundwater resources within the watershed and groundwater basin known as the Main San Gabriel Basin.

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# WATERMASTER AND ITS PARTNERS HAVE ADDED 4.69 MILLION ACRE-FEET TO THE BASIN

In the 50 years since its founding, Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster's (Watermaster or MSGBWM) collaborative programs have added nearly 4.7 million acre-feet of water to the Main San Gabriel Basin (Main Basin). Future local projects will add even more. The Pure Water Southern California recycling project is expected to contribute up to an additional 80,000 acre-feet per year to the Basin when completed.



### LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER

### A HISTORY OF SUCCESSFUL COLLABORATION AND ADAPTATION

The story of Watermaster and the San Gabriel Basin is one of partnership and resilience. Since Watermaster's formation, we have collaborated to maintain a stable and reliable water supply through decades of profound change.

**Facing climate whiplash with confidence.** The 2010s, possibly the driest period in 1,200 years, were followed by the wettest two years on record (2022–2024) and then a return to less than half of normal rainfall in 2024–2025. Careful planning and regional cooperation ensured reliability throughout these dramatic shifts.

*Groundwater level gains.* The Basin's water level rose more than seven feet this year, driven by aggressive Resource Development Assessment (RDA) purchases and other recharge programs.

*Sustained conservation success.* Total water demand has fallen about 30% from its peak thanks to broad-based demand reductions.

*Proactive water quality management.* Watermaster's proactive testing and basinwide management keep our supplies safe and stable despite changing legislation and regulatory requirements.

**Addressing new threats with regional solutions.** Watermaster will continue to productively address the emerging challenges in the Basin.

**Invasive mussels demand a coordinated response.** Mussels are already impacting water imports. We must safeguard the State Water Project and Colorado River supplies, two cornerstones of our region's water supply.

**Pure Water Southern California requires regional support.** Funding for this crucial project is threatened by competing regional projects. Securing Pure Water's drought-proof supply of up to 80,000 acre-feet annually is a top priority, and we will continue to advocate vigorously for its completion.

**Shared success through partnership.** Watermaster's achievements are possible only through the collaboration of our many stakeholders. As I complete my first year as Executive Officer, I look forward to working together to ensure a reliable, sustainable future for the Basin.





## **Increased Recharge and Groundwater Levels**


According to historical records, the period from the 2010s to the early 2020s included the driest period in the past 1,200 years. Then came 2022–2024—the wettest two-year period on record. This year, conditions shifted again: **2024–25 was one of the driest years in history** with less than half of average rainfall (about 8"). These fluctuations exemplify the **extreme climate whiplash** now shaping Basin conditions. Watermaster's active management ensures sustainable supplies despite unpredictable circumstances.




Rainfall in the San Gabriel Valley during 2024–25 was 8.42"—less than half the historical long-term average and one of the driest years on record. Notably, 18 of the past 26 years have recorded below-average rainfall.



Rainfall and runoff conserved were both about 45% of average in 2024–25. The low yield is primarily due to timing; most of the limited rain fell early in the season, when dry soils absorb more.




Although water demand rose slightly due to dry weather, it remains very low overall—about 70% of peak use. Rebate incentives, drought restrictions, and education programs have driven a sustained downward trend for almost 20 years despite population growth.



During this exceptionally dry year, local recharge fell to just 49,000 acre-feet, barely 45% of average. Watermaster bolstered Basin levels with 30,000 acre-feet of RDA imports, avoiding a severe shortfall.

The Basin experienced extreme climate whiplash again—the two wettest years on record followed by one of the driest years ever.



RDA and Cyclic Storage keep water levels manageable in an otherwise dry year, contributing over 450,000 acre-feet of storage.

# Strategies for Maintaining Basin Balance

Watermaster maintains long-term balance in the Basin using a variety of strategies, including traditional management techniques and innovative approaches adapted to the Basin's unique needs. Two of the most important management tools are the Resource Development Assessment (RDA) and the Operating Safe Yield (OSY).

### A HOLISTIC APPROACH TO BASIN MANAGEMENT

### **KEY TOOLS FOR ENHANCING SUPPLIES**

**Operating Safe Yield.** The low OSY encourages conservation and triggers steady purchases of imported water when supplies are available.

**Resource Development Assessment.** The RDA generates funds for supplemental water purchases, supporting long-term Basin recharge and reliability.

# STORAGE INCENTIVES TO INCREASE GROUNDWATER LEVELS

**Cyclic Storage.** Producers can purchase and store Replacement Water when it's available and draw it down when it's needed, increasing reserves and stabilizing prices.

**In-Lieu Program.** Producers can deliver treated water in lieu of pumped water, reducing groundwater demand.

**Letter Agreement with MWD.** Metropolitan Water District can deliver available water in advance of demand with delayed payment, increasing reserves and stabilizing prices.

**Replacement Water Surcharge.** This assessment encourages pre-purchase of water demands, stabilizing demand and prices.

**Reverse Cyclic Storage.** Responsible agencies can pre-purchase State Water Project supplies at today's prices for later delivery.

### **FUTURE PLANNING TO PRESERVE SUPPLIES**


Groundwater Model. Sophisticated analysis ensures informed decision-making about Basin management.

**Stormwater and Runoff Capture.** Watermaster is supporting studies to understand how stormwater capture and recycled urban runoff could stabilize Basin levels to increase long-term supplies.

**Colorado River Water.** Plans are in development with MWD, Responsible Agencies, and the Los Angeles County Flood Control District on opportunities for Replenishment Water deliveries, increasing long-term supplies.

**Pure Water Southern California.** This innovative project could supply up to 80,000 acre-feet of recycled water, permanently increasing long-term supplies.

# PROACTIVE GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT KEEPS THE BASIN IN THE TARGET RANGE OVER TIME



Despite the exceptionally dry 2024–25 season, Key Well levels rose about 7 feet to 247 feet—near the upper end of the Basin's target operating range.

Basin levels have risen considerably over the last 10 years because of successful Basin management.

## This Year's Key Water Management Actions



The RDA and OSY remain the primary tools for managing the Main Basin groundwater supply. They are supplemented by a wide variety of management tools that together ensure long-term reliability.

### RDA HELPS ENSURE BASIN RELIABILITY

The Resource Development Assessment is one of Watermaster's most essential tools for managing water supplies. Established in 2014, the program collects a basinwide assessment of \$175 per acre-foot from Producers, creating a dedicated fund to purchase imported water whenever available. Watermaster designed this program to protect the Basin through even the harshest conditions—up to 15 years of sustained drought.

**The RDA has proven its value.** Since the program began, Watermaster has purchased and stored more than 224,000 acre-feet of imported water—roughly a full year's supply—raising groundwater levels by 28 feet.

The RDA also fosters a regional approach to Basin management, uniting the Responsible Agencies and enjoying strong support from the Court, Metropolitan Water District, and the County of Los Angeles. This collective framework ensures that all Producers contribute and all benefit while building long-term reliability for the Basin.

Over the next decade, inflation will reduce RDA's purchasing power.


Facing higher water costs, Watermaster is evaluating options to maintain RDA's effectiveness, such as targets, goals, assessment increases, or supplemental funds. The Board intends to renew and strengthen the RDA, preserving it as a cornerstone of Basin reliability.

### LOW OSY SUPPORTS GROUNDWATER STABILITY

The Operating Safe Yield is the annual amount of groundwater that can be pumped from the Basin without replacement. From 2014–15 to 2023–24, the OSY was 150,000 acre-feet, reflecting unprecedented drought conditions. For 2024–25, thanks to RDA imports, conservation, and improved storage, Watermaster increased the OSY to 160,000 acre-feet, following two years of above-average rainfall and stormwater capture. That higher level is providing Producers with stability and avoiding costly Replacement Water obligations.

In April 2025, Watermaster's Preliminary OSY Report reaffirmed 160,000 acre-feet for 2025–26 but recommended 140,000 acre-feet annually for 2026–2030 in anticipation of continued dry conditions. The Board unanimously adopted the recommendation in May.

The RDA program has brought a regional approach to Basin management, demonstrating that the Basin has both the storage capacity and the financial tools to secure water for future needs.

For the Main San Gabriel Basin, the Pure Water Project is a necessity, and Watermaster will advocate intensely for it. Without it, the region will remain dependent on increasingly unreliable imports.

# PURE WATER SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA IS THE KEY TO LONG-TERM RELIABILITY

Pure Water Southern California is the most important long-term supply project for the Main San Gabriel Basin. A partnership between MWD and the Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts, Pure Water will recycle treated wastewater into up to 150 million gallons per day (about 155,000 acre-feet per year) of new, drought-proof water supply. Once operational (planned for about 2033), the Pure Water Project will supply the Main Basin with up to 80,000 acre-feet annually for groundwater replenishment.

### PURE WATER YIELDS LASTING BENEFITS FOR THE REGION

**Drought-proof supply** – Uses year-round treated wastewater, unaffected by rainfall or climate swings.

**Reduced imported water dependence** – Decreases reliance on vulnerable supplies from the Colorado River and State Water Project.

**Stabilized water levels** – Ensures resilience by creating a dependable supply, enabling operational flexibility.

Widespread benefits - Frees up imported water for other California communities and ecosystems.

### **ESSENTIAL, NOT OPTIONAL: PROTECTING PURE WATER'S FUTURE**

After resolving a longstanding lawsuit with San Diego, some at MWD indicated reduced commitment to Pure Water, citing competing financial demands from the Delta Conveyance Project, Sites Reservoir, and new water purchases or transfers from San Diego County. Watermaster maintains that Pure Water must remain a regional priority. Pure Water Southern California strengthens regional reliability, freeing up imported supplies even for areas it doesn't directly serve. It remains a cost-effective, sustainable source with secure financing from participating agencies that are already adjusting rates to fund it.

# CONSERVATION KEEPS DEMAND NEAR HISTORIC LOWS

Water demand in the Main Basin remains far below historic levels, even with a modest usage uptick in 2024–25 due to dry weather. Total production was about 190,000 acrefeet—roughly 10% below the 10-year average and nearly 20% below early-2000s use.

Per capita consumption has dropped by 30% since the mid-2000s, reflecting sustained savings from the use of efficient appliances, irrigation limits, and leak repairs. Regional demand is now among the lowest in California, demonstrating that conservation has become a lasting ethic, not just a response to drought.

# REVERSE CYCLIC PROGRAM SECURES TOMORROW'S WATER AT TODAY'S PRICES

The Reverse Cyclic Storage Program allows MWD Member Agencies to pre-pay for water at current rates and take delivery from MWD within five years. This forward-looking approach locks in more affordable water and ensures availability when supplies are tight.

# LETTER AGREEMENTS BUILD STORAGE AND STRENGTHEN PARTNERSHIPS

Watermaster, the Responsible Agencies, and MWD have developed innovative letter agreements that allow MWD to deliver large blocks of imported water during wet years—when supplies are abundant and costs are lower—with repayment spread over up to 10 years.

In FY 2024–25, Watermaster, MWD, and Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District (Upper Water) added nearly 160,000 acre-feet to the letter agreements, to be purchased by 2034. A portion of RDA Funds collected will apply to Upper Water's Readiness-to-Serve (RTS) charges: around \$4 million in 2025–26 and projected to be around \$7.5 million in 10 years.

These agreements are possible due to Watermaster's financial strength, supported by the RDA, and the relationship of mutual trust with MWD. The mutually beneficial arrangements help MWD move water it might not otherwise sell and secure affordable supplies for the Basin for long-term storage.

# THREE-YEAR PURCHASED WATER PLAN: GUIDING NEAR-TERM NEEDS

Each year, Watermaster prepares a Three-Year Purchased Water Plan, as required by the Judgment, to forecast supplemental water needs and outline potential sources. The 2024–25 plan confirmed that no emergency purchases were needed after two wet years but projected continued RDA purchases when available.





# INVASIVE MUSSEL MITIGATION PROTECTS ACCESS TO IMPORTED WATER

Invasive mussels pose a growing threat to Southern California's water supplies. Quagga mussels, which reproduce rapidly and can overwhelm pipelines and facilities, have long been a major concern for water conveyance systems. Their presence in the Colorado River has already limited imports into the Basin.

In FY 2024–25, attention turned to the emerging risk of golden mussels, which are even more prolific because they can thrive in a wider range of water conditions. If introduced locally, they could clog valves, intake screens, and spreading grounds, potentially forcing Los Angeles County Flood Control to halt acceptance of State Water Project deliveries. Such a shutdown would severely disrupt Basin replenishment, particularly in a drought.

Watermaster worked closely with County Flood Control, MWD, Responsible Agencies, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and local Producers to strengthen monitoring, update mitigation plans, and advocate for statewide action.

# PROTECTING WATER RIGHTS DURING MONUMENT GROWTH

With the expansion of the San Gabriel Mountains National Monument in 2024, Watermaster continues to stay engaged in the protection of water rights, facilities, access, and infrastructure by monitoring plans as they are developed.

# REPLACEMENT WATER/SURCHARGE ACCOUNTING ENCOURAGES PROACTIVE WATER MANAGEMENT

The Replacement Water/Surcharge Accounting program adds a \$100 per acre-foot charge to water pumped beyond a Producer's allocation. This surcharge creates a strong incentive to secure cyclic water at the direct rate rather than face higher overproduction costs. The approach lowers expenses for Producers, gives Watermaster the flexibility to order water earlier in the year when supplies are plentiful, and ensures fairness by requiring surcharge funds to be used exclusively to purchase water for the Producer who paid them.

Golden mussels have not yet been detected locally, and collective preventive action is essential to maintaining vital access to the State Water Project.

## **Protecting Water Quality and Water Rights**

Charged by the Court Judgment with protecting Basin water quality, Watermaster closely tracks changing regulations and emerging contaminants. We maintain full compliance with today's standards and anticipate tomorrow's requirements, using rigorous monitoring and advanced testing to stay ahead of evolving water quality challenges.


### MONITORING AND PREPARING FOR QUALITY REGULATIONS

**Watermaser conducts Title 22 water quality monitoring across the Basin,** providing economies of scale, improving coordination with regulators, enabling better overall water quality management, and giving Producers a comprehensive view of emerging issues. This basinwide approach helps ensure compliance and enables a faster response to new standards.

**Helping the Basin respond cost-effectively to regulations.** Proactive testing supported rapid response to contaminants such as NDMA and 1,4-dioxane. When California adopted a new maximum contaminant level for hexavalent chromium (Cr6) in November 2024, years of coordinated sampling and treatment planning meant that Producers could comply swiftly and cost-effectively.

**Watermaster is tracking potential regulations** for 1,2,3-TCP, perchlorate, microplastics, lead and copper, PFAS, nitrosamines, and cyanotoxins. Regional coordination reduces costs by allowing agencies to plan and implement treatment more efficiently.

**Watermaster completed baseline PFAS testing in 2022** for all active wells not under state monitoring orders. Results showed some wells with PFOA and PFOS above the proposed United States Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) standards. Many Producers have already installed or planned treatment systems, and Watermaster's early data supports compliance planning, plume tracking, and potential polluter accountability. This head start helps Producers stay ahead of PFAS regulations.



### **USER IDENTIFIED FOR WHITTIER NARROWS OPERABLE UNIT WATER**

Watermaster negotiated another one-year extension of the production agreement with the LA County Department of Parks and Recreation and the Department of Toxic Substances Control to deliver treated water to Legg Lake from the Whittier Narrows Operable Unit. During this extension, negotiations are underway with a water purveyor who will start purchasing WNOU water by 2026, fulfilling Watermaster's commitment to beneficial use of all treated groundwater.

### **FIVE-YEAR WATER QUALITY AND SUPPLY PLAN RENEWED**

Watermaster completed its annual update of the comprehensive Five-Year Plan, which reviews the Basin's water supply and quality, projects future conditions, and identifies strategies to protect and strengthen the supply and quality of the region's water resources.

### **DISCUSSIONS BEGIN ON KEY BPOU AGREEMENTS**

The Baldwin Park Operable Unit Project Agreement is up for renewal in 2027, and pre-negotiation meetings are ongoing.

Watermaster's new Water Quality Monitoring Policy establishes criteria for testing for emerging contaminants from PFAS to microplastics, helping Producers stay ahead of evolving regulations to safeguard the Basin.



## **Collaboration Improves Service and Savings**



# COLLABORATING TO ADDRESS THE READINESS-TO-SERVE CHARGE

MWD imposes a Readiness-to-Serve (RTS) charge to cover fixed infrastructure costs. For Upper Water, which serves the Main Basin, the RTS is projected to increase to \$7.5 million by 2035. Watermaster and the Producers agreed to cover RTS charges through the RDA. This cooperation ensures that Upper Water can continue bringing in water—even in years with lower sales—and fairly shares the burden across all Producers within the service area.

# STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT AND OUTREACH FOR UNIFIED MESSAGING

Watermaster continues its outreach and education efforts to connect with all stakeholder groups—Producers, cities, regulators, and the public.

### "THE WATERS THAT CONNECT US" CAMPAIGN SUPPORTS MEMBER AGENCY OUTREACH

Watermaster's outreach complements rather than duplicates local agency efforts. Social media and newsletters now focus on basinwide topics such as groundwater levels, major projects like Pure Water Southern California, and water quality, while retail agencies handle local conservation tips. Accordingly, Watermaster retired its independent billboard campaign and now co-sponsors agency events, ensuring consistent, region-wide messaging and a unified story about Basin water management.

### **MEETING STAKEHOLDERS WHERE THEY ARE**

Watermaster engages with stakeholders in a variety of forums:

- Presentations to local governments, suppliers, and regulators
- Participation in regional forums, workshops, and study sessions
- Regular engagement through social media and video channels
- Website enhancements and educational portals

# EFFICIENT ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT FOR LOCAL AGENCIES

Watermaster supports seven allied water agencies with administrative services. This agreement gives supported agencies access to expert administrative support and resources while providing economies of scale for everyone, without compromising Watermaster's duties in the Main Basin.

### 3D GROUNDWATER MODEL SUPPORTS INFORMED BASIN MANAGEMENT

Watermaster's 3D groundwater model provides vital information for Basin management decisions. In FY 2024–25, it was a crucial tool in analyzing the BPOU cleanup progress: The Cooperating Respondents (CRs) use their own model to manage treatment obligations, but Watermaster's model provides independent verification based on Producer pumping and water quality data. This ensures cleanup decisions are based on sound science and protects stakeholders from financial burdens.

### PROTECTING WATER SUPPLIES THROUGH HABITAT CONSERVATION

Watermaster continues to coordinate with the US Army Corps of Engineers, US EPA, Los Angeles County, and other stakeholders to ensure that habitat conservation efforts along the San Gabriel River are compatible with water supply and recharge operations.

**Advocacy for water quality restoration.** This year, Watermaster raised concerns about the ongoing use of Lario Park to process debris and hazardous waste from the 2025 Eaton Fire. While intended to protect neighborhoods, the riverside site presents potential water quality risks. At Watermaster's urging, site monitoring was undertaken, though no contamination has been detected to date.

### WATERMASTER CONTINUES TO ADVOCATE FOR CO-EQUAL GOALS

**Balancing habitat protection and water supply.** Through ongoing engagement, Watermaster ensures that critical habitat protections, including for the Santa Ana sucker fish, are balanced with the need to divert and recharge stormwater, protecting both ecosystems and Basin reliability.

WATERMASTER HELPS IMPLEMENT THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY

**WATER PLAN** 

The Los Angeles County Water Plan (CWP) outlines strategies for resilient water management across four areas of influence. Watermaster is directly involved in two: Groundwater Management & Quality and Regional Supply Reliability. As implementation moves forward, Watermaster looks to remain an active partner, ensuring that local needs are represented in funding decisions and regional projects while strengthening collaboration with neighboring basins.

### **Expert, Effective Administration**

### A RECORD OF EXEMPLARY SERVICE TO THE BASIN

Watermaster remains committed to delivering excellent service while effectively managing the Basin for the benefit of all stakeholders:

- A new cloud-based water accounting system is being developed that gives Producers real-time online access and reduced reporting time, from days to hours is being developed.
- Streamlined well application processing saves time and money for Watermaster and agencies.
- Remote meeting access allows broader participation.
- Efficient administration ensures lower direct and indirect costs.

### **CLEAN AUDIT REPORT ISSUED FOR FY 2024–25**

Watermaster received a clean audit report again this year. Watermaster's consistent clean audits indicate strong financial management and reflect its dedication to effective stewardship and high-quality, accurate financial reporting.

### WATERMASTER RECOGNIZED FOR LOW INSURANCE LOSS RATIO AGAIN

**Ongoing commitment to loss reduction recognized by industry.** The Association of California Water Agencies/Joint Powers Insurance Authority (ACWA/JPIA) once again honored Watermaster for maintaining a 0% Loss Ratio (losses divided by premiums) for Medical, Worker's Compensation, and Liability/Property Programs in FY 2024–25. The commendation recognizes Watermaster for having no insurance claims during the past year, reflecting a strong focus on risk management and safe, prudent operations.

# BUDGET & ASSESSMENTS: APPROVED BUDGETS, ASSESSMENT SCHEDULES, VARIANCES TO PLAN

Prudent financial management allows Watermaster to maintain stable costs while providing exceptional service and effective Basin management.

#### STABLE BUDGET AND ASSESSMENTS

On May 7, 2025, Watermaster adopted a \$5.9 million administrative budget for FY 2025–26, an increase of only \$0.5 million over the previous year. Despite inflationary pressures, all regular assessments are unchanged and Watermaster's financial position remains strong.

**The Administrative Assessment was held to \$21/acre-foot for a second year.** Due to internal cost controls and increased pumping during the drier water year, Watermaster maintained the assessment at \$21/acre-foot of production.

In-Lieu Assessment held at \$5/acre-foot. The In-Lieu Assessment was held at the reduced level established in FY 2023–24.

**Resource Development Assessment remains unchanged for the fifth consecutive year.** The RDA of \$175/acre-foot of production funds the purchase of supplemental water to guard against drought conditions. The RDA was last increased in FY 2021–22.

**Replacement Water Assessment base rates remain stable.** The Judgment requires Replacement Water Assessments on over-production by any Producer. Replacement Water rates are set annually by individual Responsible Agencies.

### THANK YOU, LUPE ARTIS!

In October, Watermaster recognized Lupe Artis on the occasion of her retirement. Ms. Artis began her 34-year career with Watermaster at Upper Water in November 1990, making her the longest-tenured employee in Watermaster history. Throughout her remarkable career, Ms. Artis was known for her outstanding leadership and service and widely respected for her deep and intuitive understanding of Watermaster's responsibilities.

### **THANK YOU, BEN LEWIS!**

In December, Watermaster issued a resolution thanking Benjamin Lewis, Jr., for his service to Watermaster in 2023 and 2024 and recognizing him for his exceptional service during his tenure as a Board Member and Producer Member.

### **THANK YOU, DARIN KASAMOTO!**

In July, Darin Kasamoto retired after 25 years as general manager of the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District. Watermaster thanks Mr. Kasamoto for his many years of service and partnership in key projects throughout the Basin.

## **Balancing the Lower Area Credit**

### OVER DELIVERY TO THE CENTRAL BASIN REACHES OVER 480,000 ACRE-FEET

### **LOWER AREA CREDIT CONTINUES TO GROW**


Under the 1965 Long Beach Judgment, the Central Basin downstream of Whittier Narrows (the Lower Area) is entitled to 50% of usable water from the watershed that feeds both basins. Based on 10-year rainfall averages, San Gabriel River Watermaster currently calculates the Lower Area's annual entitlement at 75,600 acre-feet.

Starting in the wet years of the early 1990s, the Lower Area has accumulated a water credit to the Upper Basin, reflecting significant over delivery relative to the obligation created by the Judgment. Recent wet years have accelerated that trend, resulting in a significant water credit. As of May 2025, the Lower Area has received a total of 480,584 acre-feet over its allotted share from the watershed.

Watermaster, San Gabriel River Watermaster, and the San Gabriel Valley Protective Association will all benefit from the greater predictability of a rebalanced credit. This is especially true given the increasingly volatile hydrological conditions in the area.

One possible strategy for rebalancing the credit would be to reduce releases from the Upper Area Canyon reservoirs. Watermaster is committed to fair, effective regional water management and looks forward to collaborating with regional agencies to address this credit.

While solutions are being sought, Watermaster continues to maintain the Make-Up Water Fund in case future conditions require Replacement Water for the Lower Area.



Positive bars show over delivery from the Main Basin to the Central Basin based on the Judgment.

At the end of the 2023–24 water year, the Central Basin had accrued a cumulative water credit to the Main Basin of 480,584 acre-feet—an increase of more than 80,000 acre-feet over the previous water year.


#### APPENDIX B MAIN SAN GABRIEL BASIN OVERVIEW

#### INTRODUCTION

The Main San Gabriel Basin is situated in the southeasterly portion of Los Angeles County, bounded on the north by the San Gabriel Mountains, on the northwest by Raymond Basin, on the southeast by Puente Basin, and on the south by Central Basin.

#### FORMATION AND PURPOSE OF WATERMASTER

The Main San Gabriel Basin groundwater and surface water rights were adjudicated in 1973, and the Court established the Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster (Watermaster) to manage the water supply and water quality of the Main San Gabriel Basin. The Judgment was entered January 4, 1973, and from its inception, water quality has been one of Watermaster's responsibilities. Section 26m of the original Judgment (amended Section 34m) states "Water quality in the Basin shall be a concern of Watermaster and all reasonable steps shall be taken to assist and encourage appropriate regulatory agencies to enforce reasonable water quality regulations affecting the Basin..."



#### **OVERVIEW**

County: Los Angeles (southeasterly portion).

Area: 107,000 acres/167 square miles.

#### **BASIN LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION:**

The Main San Gabriel Basin occupies most of the San Gabriel Valley. It encompasses about 107,000 acres, and the amount of groundwater in storage was 8.6 million acre-feet when the groundwater elevation at the Baldwin Park Key Well was 316 feet on September 30, 1944. In general, one foot of groundwater elevation change is equivalent to about 8,000 acre-feet in storage. Hydrogeologically, the San Gabriel groundwater Basin is divided between three adjudicated sub-basins: Main Basin, Puente Basin, and portions of Six Basins area.

In addition, there is the Spadra sub-basin, which is not adjudicated. Collectively, the Main San Gabriel Basin and Puente Basin are bounded on the north by the San Gabriel Mountains, on the east by the San Jose Hills, on the south by the Puente Hills, and on the west by the Raymond Fault. The San Gabriel River and Rio Hondo, a distributary of the San Gabriel River, drain the San Gabriel River watershed. The Puente Basin

is in the southeast and is a tributary of the Main Basin. The Six Basins area is located in the northeast, and a portion is tributary of the Main Basin. They are each adjudicated and managed separately. The aquifers are located inland (saltwater intrusion is not a risk) and are unconfined. In the San Gabriel Valley, average precipitation over the past 100 years is approximately 18.5 inches, but the average over the past ten years is only 17.2 inches.

The major sources of natural recharge to the Main San Gabriel Basin are rainfall infiltration on the valley floor and runoff from the nearby mountains. The Main San Gabriel Basin is the first of a series of basins (including Puente, Central, and West Coast Basins) to receive the benefit of mountain runoff, and the Basin interacts hydrogeologically and institutionally with these adjoining basins. In the mid-1800s, agriculture and ranching were the primary economy in the Basin. The Main San Gabriel Basin's current land use is primarily urban.

Total production over the past ten years, including groundwater and treated local surface water has been decreasing, peaking at about 242,900 acre-feet in fiscal year 2012-13 and falling to about 168,400 acre-feet by fiscal year 2022-23. Fiscal year 2024-25 production has slightly increased to about 189,300 acre-feet. Municipal water purveyors conduct the majority of pumping, and a lesser amount of production is conducted by rock and gravel companies. Most communities depend almost entirely on the Main San Gabriel Basin groundwater for their water supply, and also benefit from indirect access to untreated imported water, which is used to replenish the groundwater Basin.

#### **NEED FOR ADJUDICATION**

Beginning in the 1940s, the San Gabriel Valley experienced rapid urbanization as well as a decrease in recharged wastewater due to an increase in sewage exports. This led to increased demand for water drawn from the Main San Gabriel Basin. By the 1950s, the Main San Gabriel Basin was in a state of overdraft and parties downstream from the Main San Gabriel Basin, including agricultural and urban water purveyors in the Central and West Coast Basins, became concerned. These downstream users (primarily the municipal providers for Compton, Long Beach, and the Central Basin), who relied on the San Gabriel River system for their natural water supply as it flowed through the Whittier Narrows, initiated a legal action (the Long Beach Judgment of 1965). This resulted in a court decision requiring Main San Gabriel Basin water users to guarantee a defined and calculated annual amount of water to downstream basins. For several years, the Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District (USGVMWD) administered and took responsibility for the Main San Gabriel Basin's obligations to these downstream groundwater basin water users. In 1968, the Main San Gabriel Basin municipal water producers requested that the Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District file a complaint to adjudicate water rights in the Main San Gabriel Basin and bring Main San Gabriel Basin producers under the control of one governing body. This complaint, initiated by municipal users and filed by the Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District, became the basis for the 1973 Main San Gabriel Basin Judgment. Rather than adjudicate on the basis of mutual prescription, as was done in the Central and West Coast Basins, municipal users in the San Gabriel Valley chose to negotiate in a "friendly" adjudication. The water association commissioned a consultant and legal counsel to develop the negotiated settlement and management plan. This became the stipulated Judgment, which was accepted by the court in 1973.

#### **JUDGMENT AND AMENDMENTS**

Type of action: Stipulated Judgment and lawsuit.

<u>Adjudication initiated</u>: 1968 <u>Adjudication finalized</u>: 1973

Revisions or amendments: 1989, 1991, 1992, 2012

Other significant dates: 1965 Long Beach Judgment and 1972 Puente Narrows Agreement.

Costs: \$4,000,000 to \$5,000,000 per year.

#### **DECREE SUMMARY:**

The Main San Gabriel Judgment defined water rights for about 190 original parties, created the Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster as the governing body, and described a Physical Solution for water

management. The Physical Solution provides for Watermaster control of Basin management, and flexibility in initiating cooperative agreements, regulating and controlling pumping, purchasing replacement water, and determining the natural and operational safe yields (see below). The Judgment allows for overproduction of rights, but overproduction incurs a Replacement Water Assessment. Subsequent amendments clarified and extended Watermaster's role. Both groundwater and surface water rights in the Main San Gabriel Basin were adjudicated under five classes of water rights. 1) Groundwater rights based on mutual prescription (see Raymond Basin) and comprised about 95 percent of annual water rights for direct use. Each pumper's share was a percentage of the total adjudicated rights. 2) Base annual diversion rights, which are surface rights held by parties not owning groundwater (prescriptive) pumping rights. 3) Integrated production rights held by Producers with combined surface and groundwater rights, which allows for greater diversions and use of less groundwater in wet years, and then carrying over unused prescriptive rights to the following year. 4) Special rights that are allocated to MWD for its dam and reservoir and to LA County Flood Control District for its reservoir. 5) Non-consumptive user rights for parties operating spreading facilities. Pumpers whose production exceeds their water rights pay an assessment to finance the purchase of replenishment water. The Judgment placed injunctions against unauthorized production, non-consumptive uses (not including spreading), unauthorized recharge, and exporting native water from the Main San Gabriel Basin.

#### JUDGMENT AMENDMENT SUMMARY:

In 1991, Watermaster was given authority to allow recharge of up to 30,000 acre-feet per year of recycled water as supplemental water and was also given authority to control pumping for water quality improvement purposes and enter into agreements with the EPA to facilitate groundwater cleanup. In 2012, Watermaster was given authority to develop and levy a Water Resource Development assessment (RDA) to bring additional untreated imported water into the Main San Gabriel Basin. Initially, Watermaster levied an RDA (referred to as RDA I) to create an emergency reserve of untreated imported water stored in the Main San Gabriel Basin to be used in the event that untreated imported water was not available to satisfy a Replacement Water obligation. As a result of the prolonged drought, Watermaster and the Producers cooperatively developed the RDA II program, which generates revenue to purchase untreated imported water to supplement the lack of stormwater replenishment as a result of continued drought conditions. The RDA II program is also complementary to the groundwater basin management mandate included in the "Sustainable Groundwater Management Act" (SGMA).

Two other judgments were acknowledged in the Main Basin adjudication. **The Long Beach Judgment,** rendered by the Superior Court in 1965, guarantees Central and West Coast Basins an average annual water supply of about 98,000 acre-feet per year through the Whittier Narrows. **The Puente Narrows Agreement** of 1972 between Puente Basin Water Agency and Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District calculates and governs subsurface outflow from Puente Basin to the Main San Gabriel Basin. This agreement calls for an average Base Underflow of 580 acre-feet per year from Puente Basin to the Main San Gabriel Basin. The Main San Gabriel Watermaster adheres to both rulings.

#### **WATER USERS**

Stipulated Users:

Stipulated users originally included about 190 parties, of which about 40 were municipal purveyors. Designated parties to the Judgment included the Upper San Gabriel Municipal Water District, the Three Valleys Municipal Water District, the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District, about 40 other public and investor-owned water supply agencies, 15 industrial customers, and eight agricultural and golf course pumpers.

#### Current Users:

About forty-five private parties or companies pump directly. A number of parties have rights to divert surface flows.

#### **MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE**

The Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster is a nine-person board appointed by the Los Angeles County Superior Court, which manages and controls the withdrawal of groundwater and surface water and coordinates water deliveries and recharge. The Watermaster Board is comprised of six individuals elected by water producers and three by water districts (two by Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District and one by the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District). Each member serves a one-year term. Several

advisory committees have been established to assist the Watermaster Board. Its membership includes Watermaster board members and may also include advisory committee members who are not Watermaster board members. Watermaster has a staff and engages consultants for special projects.

Watermaster's responsibilities include: managing and controlling the withdrawal and replenishment of water supplies in the Basin; determining the Operating Safe Yield annually; raising replenishment revenue by means of assessments, and acquiring and spreading untreated imported water for groundwater replenishment; raising revenue by means of assessments and acquiring and spreading untreated imported water to supplement the lack of stormwater runoff; coordinating local involvement in efforts to preserve and restore the quality of the Basin's groundwater; assisting and encouraging regulatory agencies to enforce water quality regulations in the Basin; collecting production, water quality, and other relevant data from producers; and preparing an annual report.

The Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District, Three Valleys Municipal Water District, and San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District deliver supplemental State Water Project (SWP) water to the Basin. The County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works (LACDPW) plays a role in ensuring groundwater Basin replenishment from local stormwater runoff is coordinated with replenishment of supplemental SWP water. The San Gabriel Basin Water Quality Authority obtains some funding for the Main San Gabriel Basin's cleanup activities. The San Gabriel River Watermaster calculates the Main San Gabriel Basin's credits and debits pursuant to the terms of the Long Beach Judgment.

#### **MANAGEMENT STRATEGIES**

Main San Gabriel Basin demand is satisfied about 85 percent from local groundwater, 10 percent from treated imported water, and 5 percent from other local supplies (recycled water and local surface water diversions). In addition, an average of about 40,000 acre-feet per year of untreated imported water has historically been delivered for Main San Gabriel Basin replenishment (Replacement Water). Also, during fiscal year 2016-17, Watermaster implemented the RDA program to deliver untreated imported water to the Main San Gabriel Basin to supplement stormwater runoff replenishment. The RDA program delivered about 30,000 acre-feet of RDA funds was applied through MWD's Cyclic Storage Letter Agreement during fiscal year 2024-25. The typical Main San Gabriel Basin operating range for water levels is between 200 and 250 feet MSL (above mean sea level).

There are about 17 spreading basins in the Main San Gabriel Basin, covering more than 1,100 acres, which are operated by Los Angeles County Department of Public Works (LACDPW) or other agencies capable of capturing stormwater runoff from adjacent canyons and/or imported water. The spreading capacity of existing facilities is more than 600,000 acre-feet per year.

Since 2011–12, Watermaster has brought in an additional 224,800 acre-feet of RDA water and 730,300 acre-feet of imported untreated water, representing about 119 feet at the Key Well.

In 1983, the agencies in the San Gabriel River Watershed formed the Groundwater Replenishment Committee. They agreed to coordinate deliveries of local, recycled, and imported water for groundwater replenishment and identify future needs and potential replenishment facilities.

Watermaster, municipal water districts, and Producers have various cyclic storage agreements in which untreated imported water is stored in the Main San Gabriel Basin and extracted when imported water supplies are short. Imported water is credited to these cyclic storage accounts.

Metropolitan also delivers replenishment water to the Main San Gabriel Basin, through sales to Three Valleys Municipal Water District and Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District. During calendar year 2017, calendar year 2019, and calendar year 2024, Metropolitan entered into separate agreements to deliver untreated imported water into the Main Basin, with payment arrangements for the water occurring in equal amounts over five consecutive years for 2017 and 2019 and ten consecutive years for 2024 and 2025.

#### MONITORING AND REPORTING

There are about 250 wells in the Main San Gabriel Basin, 200 of which are active. There are about 20 non-municipal wells. Most of these wells are monitored by Watermaster for water quality parameters. In addition, the Basin-wide Groundwater Elevation Monitoring Program (BGWEMP) is a network of wells in the Main San

Gabriel Basin that are regularly measured by the Watermaster on a permanent basis. The program is designed to facilitate coordination of existing water-level monitoring done by agencies. In addition, each adjudicated party is obligated to file a quarterly report with the Watermaster showing the total pumping and diversion amounts.

#### SAFE YIELD

Groundwater storage capacity was determined by Department of Water Resources (DWR) in 1975 to be 10,438,000 acre-feet. The Main San Gabriel Basin Judgment determined the Natural Safe Yield of Main Basin to be 152,700 acre-feet on the basis of 1967 conditions but is close to 185,000 acre-feet based on 2016 conditions. Watermaster annually determines the Operating Safe Yield (OSY) as the amount of groundwater that can be pumped in a fiscal year without replacement water assessments. The main factors in making this determination are rainfall, runoff amounts, and groundwater levels. In 2005-06, the OSY was 240,000 acre-feet, and in 2024-25 the OSY was 160,000 acre-feet. Producers may pump in excess of annual pumping rights but must pay for supplemental, untreated imported water to replenish the Basin. Any entity that wishes to spread or store supplemental water within the Main San Gabriel Basin for later recovery must have a cyclic storage agreement with the Watermaster. These agreements typically have five-year or ten-year terms.

#### GROUNDWATER PUMPING AND OVERDRAFT

In 1944, water stored in the Main San Gabriel Basin was approximately 8,600,000 acre-feet and had decreased to 7,900,000 acre-feet by 1960. The Main San Gabriel Basin was considered over-drafted since 1953, which prompted the Main Basin adjudication. Since the establishment of Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster, groundwater recharge (local and imported water) in the valley has averaged about 150,000 acre-feet per year. As part of the Judgment, Watermaster recharges replacement water to maintain the water level at the Baldwin Park Key Well above elevation 200 feet. The highest operational groundwater elevation at the Key Well since the Judgment was 294 feet in 1983. In 2018, the groundwater elevation at the Key Well was 169 feet, which represents a historic low. Watermaster established the OSY for 2024-25 of 160,000 acre-feet, while the annual pumping production in 2024-25 was approximately 189,300 acre-feet. Consequently, the Replacement Water obligation, including withdrawal from producer cyclic storage, was about 16,500 acre-feet.

#### **WATER QUALITY ISSUES**

Four areas of the San Gabriel Valley Groundwater Basin are Superfund Sites. Contaminants such as Trichloroethylene, Perchloroethylene, Carbon Tetrachloride, Perchlorate, N- Nitrosodimethylamine, and 1, 4-Dioxane impact Whittier Narrows, Puente Basin, Baldwin Park and El Monte areas. As an example, a current project of the Watermaster (along with six other water entities) is to clean up the Baldwin Park Operable Unit. As part of the negotiated agreement, parties have agreed to pay tens of millions of dollars toward research, cost recovery, and treatment plant construction. Those facilities have operated for over 17 years and continue to operate.

#### **DROUGHT**

Watermaster undertakes many initiatives to address water shortages. These include:

- 1. Maintaining a low Operating Safe Yield (OSY).
- 2. Establishing a reliability storage program with a target reserve of 100,000 acre-feet of untreated imported water (RDA I).
- Implementing a stormwater augmentation program with a target delivery of 40,000 acre-feet per year of untreated imported water for general Basin benefit (RDA II).
- 4. Implementing a new assessment to pay for these two programs.
- Collaborating on the Metropolitan Water District (MWD) Regional Recycled Water Program, which is planned to deliver large amounts of highly treated recycled water into the Basin to supplement imported supplies and decreased local runoff in dry years.
- 6. Looking into imported Colorado River water on a limited basis for additional supply; and

The Regional Recycled Water Program is expected to bring longterm water balance to the Basin.

7. Expanding retail conservation outreach.

#### PRODUCTION AND REPLENISHMENT FOR 2024-25

Management efforts are being made to ramp down pumping and 2024-25 groundwater production was approximately 189,300 acre-feet. This was higher than the OSY for 2024-25 at 160,000 acre-feet. After considering the use of carry-over rights for some of the production, about 16,500 acre-feet will need to be delivered as untreated imported water due to over production (a portion of which will be deducted from Producers' cyclic storage accounts as a pre-delivery of Replacement Water).

#### ADJUDICATION EFFECTIVENESS


The groundwater level in the Baldwin Park Key Well is used by Watermaster to monitor changes in groundwater supply for the Basin. The water level in this well fluctuated over 100 feet in elevation over the last 35 years, from a high in 1983 to a low in 2018. Nonetheless, over the four decades between its formation in 1972 and the historic extreme drought that began in 2011, Watermaster succeeded in balancing Basin supplies, with the Key Well level starting and ending that 40-year period essentially unchanged.


Over the past decade, however, winters have generally been drier. With very low local water supplies available during the historic drought, the Key well level began falling. Watermaster undertook extensive new management actions to respond to the drought as described above under "Drought" above. Nonetheless, in 2018 the groundwater elevation at the well was 169 feet, which represents a historic low.

Consequently, Watermaster implemented a series of actions described above to ensure reliable water supplies and to maintain Basin groundwater levels, which was about 247 feet above mean sea level (amsl) as of June 30, 2025, and are within the operating guidelines for the Key Well, due to above average rainfall during fiscal year 2024-25. Without Watermaster implemented actions, which includes Cyclic Storage and RDA, the Key Well would have fallen to about 193 feet.

Overall, the management structure has been effective in its ability to work collaboratively with overlapping agencies and basins (e.g., through the Long Beach Judgment and through joining regional and statewide drought and water supply programs).

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Pursuant to the Judgment in <u>Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District v. City of Alhambra, et al.</u> and its Exhibit J, Puente Narrows Agreement, the subsurface flow passing from Puente Basin to the Main San Gabriel Basin was determined for fiscal year 2024-25. This determination of subsurface flow was made in accordance with Appendix C, Engineering Criteria, to Exhibit J of the Judgment and consisted of measuring the water levels at the two key wells.

The field measurements of the water levels at the upstream well, 2S/10W-9Q, and downstream well, 2S/10W-8E3, for Fall 2024 were collected on October 2, 2024 by Mr. Tuan Nguyen of Stetson Engineers Inc. representing Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District and Mr. Charlie Devine of Civiltec Engineering Inc. representing Puente Basin Water Agency. The field measurements of the water levels at the upstream well, 2S/10W-9Q, and downstream well, 2S/10W-8E3, for Spring 2025 were collected on April 2, 2025 by Mr. Tuan Nguyen of Stetson Engineers Inc. representing Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District and Mr. Charlie Devine of Civiltec Engineering Inc. representing Puente Basin Water Agency. Based on the Fall 2024 and Spring 2025 static water levels at the key wells, the subsurface flow was determined to be 835 acre-feet for fiscal year 2024-25, as shown on Table 1.

Field inspections of the concrete-lined San Jose Creek channel were made concurrently with the field water level measurements and indicated no apparent withdrawal of flow in the San Jose Creek channel from the boundary of Spadra Basin with Puente Basin and downstream to Puente Narrows.

The Puente Narrows Agreement requires that a perpetual accounting of the subsurface flow through Puente Narrows be maintained. Presented in Table 2 is the accounting to date, showing the Accumulated Base Underflow (at 580 acre-feet per year in accordance with Paragraph 8 of the Agreement), the Annual and Accumulated Subsurface Flow to date under the Agreement, the Accumulated Credit or Debit of Puente Agency and the Adjusted Accumulated Credit or Debit of Puente Agency (from Table 3).

By Agreement dated November 30, 1989, Puente Basin Water Agency and Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District agreed that groundwater extracted from Puente Basin that is treated and discharged to the lined channel, and then percolated in the Main Basin as part of Carrier Corporation's cleanup program, which is required by the Regional Water Quality Control Board, shall be credited to

Puente Agency as subsurface outflow from Puente Basin. Evaporation losses and unusable surface outflow to the ocean are deducted from such groundwater extraction from Puente Basin. As shown on Table 3, Column 6, since fiscal-year 2007-08, Carrier stopped discharging this treated water and the water is being beneficially used in the Puente Basin.

#### Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster (a nonprofit organization), which comprise the balance sheets as of June 30, 2025 and 2024, and the related statements of revenues, expenses, and change in net assets, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster, as of June 30, 2025 and 2024, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. #### Background

The Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster (Watermaster) was created by the Los Angeles Superior Court through a stipulated judgment (LASC Case 924128) to administer water rights and manage the Main San Gabriel Groundwater Basin. The Judgment prescribes Watermaster's authorities and specifies five classes of water production assessments to be used to fund certain activities. Those assessment categories are: Administrative, Replacement Water, Make-up Water, In-Lieu, and Water Resource Development Assessment. Each class of assessment has a prescribed purpose and water production base. Assessment revenue is Watermaster's principal source of income.

Watermaster's Administrative Fund includes funds for administrative expenses as budgeted each year.

The Replacement Water Fund is an assessment collected to purchase imported water to cover any production in excess of production rights, as established with the Annual Operating Safe Yield.

The Make-up Obligation Fund is money collected to purchase Make-up Water for the Lower Areas (Central Basin) as part of the Long Beach Judgment. This assessment is reviewed annually and has been suspended since FY 1996-97 production due to water accounting credit. These funds are held in anticipation of a potential future obligation to the Lower Areas.

Watermaster's In-Lieu Assessment covers the cost of the Alhambra Exchange as well as the Direct Delivery Imported Water Program that was implemented in 2014-15, though not utilized in FY 2024-25. The Program was intended to shift an agency's groundwater production to a treated Metropolitan Water District connection to supply system demand in times of drought and consequently helping to keep groundwater levels from additional decline. This also includes Ready-to-Serve Charges, and the Capacity Charge within the Replacement Water Fund under the In-Lieu subheading.

During FY 2013-14, Watermaster adopted Resolution No. 09-13-257 declaring its intention to create a Water Resource Development Assessment (RDA) as a source of funding to pre-purchase water for basin storage and reliability. On May 14, 2014, the Board adopted Resolution No. 05-14-263 establishing the RDA for implementation on all FY 2014-15 production, with an accounting of each Producer's contribution.

During FY 2015-16, Watermaster developed a Stormwater Augmentation Program to help manage Basin water supplies under severe drought conditions. Through this, the Board revised Watermaster's Water Resource Development Assessment Policy to provide a funding source for water purchases for general, Basin-wide benefit, referred to as the RDA II. In early 2017, after significant rainfall and run-off in Northern California, MWD approached Watermaster with an opportunity to purchase excess supplies from the State Water Project. The Executive Officer and Watermaster Board negotiated a cyclic delivery to MWD's existing account in the Basin, with a 5-year payment plan, based on the RDA II assessment policy criteria. The same arrangement for an additional delivery was also approved by the Watermaster Board and MWD in early 2019. Funds from the RDA provided the mechanism to commit to this purchase of available supplemental water supplies. In addition, two additional letters were signed in FY 2024-25.

On May 1, 2024, the Watermaster Board adopted Resolution No. 05-24-320 setting FY 2023-24 assessment rates, including RDA, on all water produced during FY 2023-24. RDA II includes a ramping schedule to fund the purchase of MWD's cyclic deliveries.

#### **Summary of Financial Information**

For the year ending June 30, 2025, Watermaster's Total Assets increased by 13% to \$60 million, including an increase of 6% in Net Assets to \$54 million. The Administrative Fund had a net increase of \$395,000 primarily due to an increase in water production and LAIF interest earned. The Replacement Fund had a net increase of \$2.5 million due to the increase in water production, and the \$1.6 million in LAIF Interest Earned. The Make-Up Obligation Fund had a net increase of \$189,000. This was primarily due to LAIF interest earned of \$287,208, offset by expenses of \$98,500 due to the annual San Gabriel River watermaster invoice.

Non-current assets increased by \$3.8M due to 3,000 AF of pre-purchased water (USG5-CWEA) from Upper District for MWD Reverse Cyclic Program. The exact delivery date of the pre-purchased water from MWD has not been confirmed as of 6/30/25 but will occur within the next 5 years based on the 5-Year Agreement plan approved on 1/8/25. Once the delivery takes place, Watermaster will reclassify the prepaid water into USG5 water expense.

Current liabilities include accounts payable of \$5.5 million in the Replacement Fund. This primarily consisted of \$5.2M in producer Cyclic Storage Orders, which were paid in the summer of 2025.

Noncurrent liabilities decreased by \$4,297 for Other Postemployment Benefits (OPEB) compared to an increase of \$15,491 in the prior year due to the update of the discount rate. Watermaster's Actuarial Valuation is done every two years, which includes the following year's projections and helps minimize larger adjustments each year. Currently, Watermaster funds retiree health benefits on a pay-as-you-go basis by previously withholding a portion of annual employee salary Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA). In FY 2024-25, the Board approved the COLA for employees without additional deduction but maintained the existing 7%. These funds are set aside for the payment of current and future retiree health benefits. Currently, the market value of assets set aside for this purpose, as of June 30, 2025, is greater than the projected Accumulated Postretirement Benefit Obligation on June 30, 2025, by \$449,030.

#### **Review of Revenues and Expenses**

The Administrative Assessment revenue increased from the prior year by \$580,000 due to higher production (171,314.03 AF assessed in FY 2024-25 for water produced in 2023-24 vs.167,816.23 AF assessed in FY 2023-24 for water produced in 2022-23), with the assessment increased from \$18 to \$21 per acre-foot. The increase in Engineering Fees from the previous year was \$282,000, for Water Quality Monitoring expenses was \$49,000. A decrease in Water Quality Management expenses by \$21,000, with fewer Section 28 Staff Reports than budgeted, and for Administrative and General expenses it was \$15,000 less.

Operating revenues in the Replacement Water Fund increased by \$1.3 million primarily due to the increase in overall production for Replacement Obligation and RDA. In FY 2024-25, Cyclic Storage Water purchases increased by \$5.2M from the prior year. These orders included City of Arcadia, United Rock Product Corps, and California American Water Company. Also, in FY2024-25, overall water purchase decreased by \$16 million due to RDA water purchases. In FY 2022-23, a pending water order was delivered plus a decreased order for the year based on water available, followed by FY 2023-24 using RDA Funds available to purchase a higher order than FY 2024-25.

The In-Lieu Assessment revenue decreased by \$485,000, due to the lowering of In-Lieu assessments from \$8 to \$5, while production only increased by roughly 3,000 AF. This assessment covers the Direct Delivery In-Lieu Water Purchases Program (though not utilized this fiscal year), the Alhambra Exchange Agreement (AEA), the Ready-to-Serve Charge, and the Metropolitan Water District Capacity Charge assessed for taking treated imported water during peak demand.

#### Comparison of FY 2024-25 Administration Budget to Actual Revenues and Expenses

Administrative Assessment revenue came in higher than the budgeted amount due to production being higher than budgeted. Other Income and Reimbursements, which include BPOU Reimbursements for Labor and Overhead, came in lower than Budget by about \$13,000 due to timing of the RBMB Administrative deposit offset by an increase in the BPOU Reimbursements for Labor and Overhead. Interest Income was budgeted at \$415,000, and actual was \$545,000.

Overall, Engineering and related expenses came in lower than budget by approximately 20%. These savings include Inspection and Meter Checks by \$14,000, WQ Monitoring by \$463,000, mainly due to UCMR Lab Costs and PFAS Lab Costs/Sampling. Additional savings were seen in WQ Management under Section 28 Staff reports by \$40,000 and Quagga Mussel Plan by \$8,000 lower than budgeted. These savings were offset by Engineering Fees being higher than budgeted by \$137,000. These overexpenditures include general preparation by \$174,000, Drought Management Planning by \$14,000, Fed/State General by \$19,000, and Groundwater Management Strategies by \$23,000. In FY 2024-25, Watermaster's former Executive Officer Mr. Russ Bryden introduced many new projects with Stetson Engineers that were not budgeted in the initial Engineering Budget for FY 2024-25. As such, most of these costs, many of which substantial, were classified under the general ledger "Engineering: General Meeting Preparations". Examples of these projects include Central basin and Main basin maps, Key Well valuation, Cal AM PFAS Study Review, Miller pit feasibility study, IRP local water study, and Eaton fire containment site.

Legal expenses for the year were budgeted to include Quagga Mussel Management Plan as well as preparation for BPOU negotiations, and concerns regarding environmental and habitat designations that could potentially impact water rights in the Main Basin. In total, legal expenses for fiscal year 2024-25 were 56% lower than budgeted.

Under administrative costs, areas of higher than budgeted expenditure include Accounting and Auditing Fees, Dues, and Depreciation Expenses. For the Audit expense, there was a 6% increase, under dues, WM has a new membership to SGVCOG. Depreciation expense is not a budgeted item since it only reduces the fixed assets and it's not a cash-related expense.

Budget savings in administrative costs were seen in several areas. Areas of lower than budgeted expenditure include Meeting & Travel, Salaries & Benefits, Watermaster Compensation, Building Lease O&M, Office Expense, Office Improvements, and Employee Education/Training. For the meeting/travel, Watermaster had originally budgeted for strategic planning of \$20,000 and retirement celebrations for its former Executive Officer & Controller, Tony Zampiello / Lupe Artis of \$8,000. The strategic planning budget was not used in FY 2024-25, and the retirement events were substantially lower than the budgeted amounts. Watermaster Compensation was \$9,300 lower than budget. The building lease O&M costs had savings of \$3,500, and office supplies at \$8,600. Office Improvements budget was used for office blinds, and part of the Computer Equipment/Furniture budget was used for the Executive Officer's office furniture, both are listed under Fixed Assets. Also, this year we used only 7% of the Employee Education Reimbursements budget, and 41% of the Employee Training Costs since most of our training was done through our insurance provider utilizing a benefit called Target Solutions, at no additional cost. The contingency line item of \$263,000 was left unused for FY 2024-25.

#### NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Nature of Activities**

In a judgment dated January 4, 1973, in the Superior Court of the State of California for the County of Los Angeles, the court established the Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster (Watermaster), which administers the judgment. One of the functions of Watermaster is to levy and collect funds to pay the city of Long Beach, the city of Compton, and the Central Basin Municipal Water District for make-up water to replace water used in the San Gabriel Basin which the lower area maintained was properly theirs. The payments have been made for several years through the Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District as a result of a negotiated agreement in 1965 and reaffirmed by a validation suit in the same year. The collections and disbursements of this fund are accounted for in the Make-Up Obligation Fund

Watermaster also levies and collects funds to purchase replacement water for Basin overproduction. These collections and disbursements are accounted for in the Replacement Water Fund.

All financial transactions, other than those which fall within the Make-Up Obligation Fund or Replacement Water Fund, are recorded in the Administrative Fund. Assessments are made annually.

Watermaster proposed amendments to its judgment to provide greater flexibility in carrying out its purpose. The judgment amendment was approved by the court on June 21, 2012.

#### **Basis of Accounting and Financial Statement Presentation**

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

#### **Classification of Net Assets**

Net assets, revenues, gains, and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor- or grantor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets and changes therein are classified and reported as follows:

Net Assets Without Donor Restrictions – Net assets available for use in general operations and not subject to donor (or certain grantor) restrictions.

Net Assets With Donor Restrictions – Net assets subject to donor-imposed restrictions which may be temporary in nature and met by the passage of time or other events specified by the donor. Other donor-imposed restrictions may stipulate that the resources be maintained in perpetuity.

As of June 30, 2025 and 2024, respectively, the Watermaster had no net assets with donor imposed restrictions. As such, total net assets have been reported without restrictions.

#### NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

#### **Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents consist primarily of short-term investments which have a maturity of ninety days or less. At June 30, 2025 and 2024, Watermaster invested with the State Treasurer's Local Agency Investment Fund. This is a pooled money investment account and carried at amortized cost with no restrictions on access to funds and therefore, is considered a cash equivalent.

Cash and cash equivalents at June 30, 2025 and 2024 include \$890,913 and \$795,031, respectively, that the board has designated for future other postretirement benefit obligations.

#### **Accounts Receivable and Allowance for Credit Losses**

All receivables represent amounts due from various vendors for services provided. Account Receivables are reported at the amount expected to be collected. The organization evaluates expected credit losses on an ongoing basis using historical payment trends, write off experience and aging receivables, and a review of specific accounts and adjustments are made as necessary. Receivables are written off after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted and are recognized as bad debt under the direct write off method uncollectible. The Organization periodically assesses its methodologies for estimating credit losses in consideration of actual experience, trends, and changes in the overall economic environment. Management believes no allowance for expected credit loss estimate is considered necessary based on historical credit losses and estimated future credit losses.

#### **Due from BPOU Committee**

Watermaster, along with six other water agencies, entered an agreement for groundwater cleanup in the Baldwin Park Operable Unit (BPOU). Under the agreement, responsible parties agreed to pay toward research, cost recovery, treatment plant construction and operating expenses in the cleanup effort. Watermaster bills the responsible parties and collects the funds. Due from BPOU committee receivable is considered fully collectible. The agreement specifies that if the responsible parties fail to make the required payment, Watermaster is entitled to be reimbursed by the Trustee.

#### **Capital Assets**

Capital assets are recorded at cost and Watermaster's capitalization threshold is \$5,000. Furniture and equipment are being depreciated on the straight-line method over estimated useful lives ranging from 3 to 10 years. Depreciation expense for the years ended June 30, 2025 and 2024 was \$12,038 and \$6,650, respectively.

#### **Income Taxes**

On July 31, 1981, Watermaster received a ruling from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) exempting it from federal income taxes. A similar ruling was received from the California State Franchise Tax Board (CA FTB) on October 16, 1981. As such, the Watermaster is not required to file tax returns to the IRS or the CA FTB.

#### NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

#### Classification of Revenue and Recognition

Operating revenues are earned by levying and collecting assessments from the producers based upon their amounts of production during the preceding fiscal year. These assessments are applied primarily to the purchase of replacement water and to administrative costs. Water production assessments include Administrative, In-Lieu, Make-Up Water, Replacement, and Water Resource Development. Assessments are billed on a yearly basis. Annual assessments are recognized as revenue in the period when the annual assessments are levied, based upon preceding fiscal year production. Nonoperating revenues are those derived primarily from investment income.

#### **Use of Estimates**

In preparing financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP, management is required to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **Reclassification of Prepaid Assets**

During the year ended June 30, 2025, the Organization reclassified certain prepaid expenses from current assets to long-term assets on the balance sheet. This reclassification reflects the extended benefit period of these assets, which exceeds twelve months. These items will be evaluated annually for potential impairment. Comparative figures have been restated to align with the current year's presentation. The reclassification had no impact on net income or total assets.

#### NOTE 2 CASH DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

#### **Custodial Risk**

Custodial credit risk is the risk that in the event of a bank failure, Watermaster's deposits may not be returned to it. Watermaster does not have a deposit policy for custodial credit risk. Deposits in financial institutions, reported as components of cash, were fully insured by depository insurance or secured by collateral held by the pledging financial institutions and trust department in Watermaster's name.

#### **Investment Interest Rate Risk**

Watermaster has an investment policy that limits investment maturities to no more than five years as a means of managing its exposure to fair value losses arising from increasing interest rates.

#### NOTE 2 CASH DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS (CONTINUED)

#### **Investment Credit Risk**

Watermaster's formal investment policy limits its investment choices to the following:

- 1. Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF)
- 2. U.S. Treasury and agency obligations
- 3. Fully insured certificates of deposit
- 4. Investment in local water quality and supply projects, associated with Basin cleanup objectives, through the borrowing of funds from the Make-Up Water Fund.

#### **Concentration of Investment Credit Risk**

Watermaster's formal investment policy limits any one type of investment to no more than 25% of the total portfolio, except for LAIF or U.S. Treasury and agency obligations.

#### NOTE 4 LEASES

Watermaster leases office space from the city of Azusa under a year-to-year lease agreement which may be canceled by the Watermaster or the City of Azusa at any time with a 30-day notice. In addition to the monthly rental amount, Watermaster is required to pay a percentage of management and operating expenses. Watermaster also leases certain equipment under noncancelable leases. The Organization has elected to recognize payments for short-term leases with a lease term of 12 months or less as expense as incurred and these leases are not included as lease liabilities or right of use assets on the balance sheet.

#### NOTE 5 PENSION PLAN

#### **Plan Description and Provisions**

Qualified employees are eligible to participate in the Public Agency Cost-Sharing Multiple-Employer Plan under the California Public Employees' Retirement System plan (CalPERS), a cost-sharing multiple-employer defined benefit pension plan administered by CalPERS. The Public Agency Cost-Sharing Multiple-Employer Plan is comprised of a Miscellaneous Pool and a Safety Pool. Watermaster sponsors two Miscellaneous Risk Pool plans, however, the information presented below represents the sum of the allocated pension amounts for each of Watermaster's plans (the Plan). The Plan provides retirement and disability benefits, annual cost-of-living adjustments, and death benefits to Plan members and their beneficiaries. Benefit provisions are established by state statutes, as legislatively amended, within the Public Employees' Retirement Law. Copies of CalPERS' annual financial report may be obtained from their executive office: 400 P Street, Sacramento, CA 95814.

#### **Funding Policy and Annual Pension Cost**

The Public Employees' Pension Reform Act of 2013 (PEPRA) introduced a new class of Members (PEPRA Members) and defined different assumptions and benefits for these PEPRA Members than those used for continuing members (Classic Members). Classic Members are required to contribute 7% of their annual covered salary and PEPRA Members are required to contribute 7.75% of their annual covered salary. Watermaster makes the contributions required of the Classic Members on their behalf and for their account but does not make the contributions required of the PEPRA Members. Watermaster is required to contribute annually at actuarially determined rates; the current rates are 12.52% and 7.87% of annual covered payroll for Classic Members and PEPRA Members, respectively.

The contribution requirements of plan members and Watermaster are established and may be amended by CalPERS. For fiscal year ended June 30, 2025, Watermaster's annual pension cost of \$363,688 for CalPERS was equal to Watermaster's required and actual contributions.

#### NOTE 6 POSTRETIREMENT HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN

Watermaster provides medical coverage to six active employees and three retired employees through the Association of California Water Agencies/Joint Powers Insurance Authority (ACWA/JPIA) Health Program. At retirement, Watermaster provides a contribution for the continuation of medical coverage for eligible retirees. For employees hired prior to January 1, 2013, eligibility for a Watermaster contribution requires retirement from Watermaster under PERS on or after age 55 with at least 10 years of full-time service. For employees hired after January 1, 2013, and new to PERS, eligibility for a Watermaster contribution requires retirement from Watermaster under PERS on or after age 62 with at least 10 years of full-time service. Watermaster provides for a contribution equal to a 100% of the cost of medical coverage for the retiree if electing retiree only coverage and 50% of the cost of medical coverage if electing coverage for the retiree and eligible dependents. Benefits are payable until the retiree's attained age of 65.

Watermaster currently finances benefits on a pay as you go basis. Although the plan has no segregated assets, Watermaster does maintain funds in LAIF that are designated for retiree health care costs. At June 30, 2025, the fund's designated balance was \$890,913.

#### NOTE 7 WATER RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT ASSESSMENT

Pursuant to the June 21, 2012 judgment, Watermaster has adopted Resolution No. 05-14-263 which established a Water Resource Development Assessment (RDA I) on all water produced from the Basin. This assessment is intended to aid Watermaster in the purchase and storage of 100,000 acre-feet of supplemental water to address potential future replacement water obligations in the event supplemental water supplies are interrupted in the future. The RDA will be evaluated annually and assessed over a 10-year period ending with the 2023-24 fiscal year production. Water stored under this program can be used only by action from the board under one or more of the following conditions: Watermaster's inability to deliver at least 50% of basin replacement Water for two consecutive years; damage to State Water Project or Colorado River aqueduct facilities; the implementation of a drought allocation penalty rate for the purchase of replacement water. Water stored under this program will not have any influence on the determination of the annual operating safe yield. With implementation of RDA II, RDA I was paused, but reviewed annually.

During FY 2015-16, Watermaster developed a Stormwater Augmentation Program to help manage Basin water supplies under severe drought conditions. Through this, the board revised Watermaster's Water Resource Development Assessment Policy to provide a funding source for water purchases for general, Basin-wide benefit, referred to as the RDA II. RDA II established a 5-year ramping assessment from \$40/AF to \$175/AF on all water produced in the Basin. Like RDA I, the Watermaster board will review annually to determine need. In early 2017, after significant rainfall and run-off in Northern California, MWD approached Watermaster with an opportunity to purchase excess supplies from the State Water Project. The Executive Officer and Watermaster board negotiated a cyclic delivery to MWD's existing account in the Basin, with a five-year payment plan, based on the RDA II assessment policy criteria.

The RDA I and RDA II are part of a single program. The RDA II program was an expansion of the RDA implemented for general benefit water while considering financial tolerances of rate payors. As of June 30, 2018, all funds collected through the RDA program to purchase water fall under the RDA II facet.

#### NOTE 8 DIRECT DELIVERY IMPORTED WATER PROGRAM

As a result of declining basin water levels and the prolonged drought, Watermaster established a Direct-Delivery Imported Water Program effective January 1, 2015. Through this program participating agencies will shift their demand from groundwater production to direct delivery of treated imported water. Watermaster is obligated to reimburse participating agencies for these purchases up to amounts designated by board approval.

Watermaster began levy and collection of assessments to offset this production in fiscal year 2015-16 included in the annual In-Lieu assessment.

#### NOTE 9 SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management evaluated subsequent events through September 24, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
